2nd Reading: Hebrews 5:1-6


Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins, and so he can sympathise with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too lives in the limitations of weakness. 


GOSPEL

Mark 10:46-52

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'call him here.' So they called the blind man. ;Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you!' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.



What a wonderful week we have had here at Lumen Christi College. Last week we were delighted to have been recognised by Catholic Education Western Australia as the state winner of the Quality Catholic Education (QCE) Awards in the Catholic Identity category for our 'Year of St Joseph Project'. Our Year of St Joseph project was created to mark the Catholic Church's Year of St Joseph. We set out to provide our staff, students, parents, and wider community with a range of opportunities to celebrate and learn from St Joseph.

The creation of a community-wide collage of St Joseph featured the faces of fathers, grandfathers, and father-figures in our school community. Students and staff submitted photographs of their father-figure along with a sentence about that person which detailed their love, gratitude, and appreciation. The collage was presented at our annual Fathers' Day service as a large print, on cards and as an interactive video.
