SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER - YEAR B

READINGS

First Reading:

Acts 10:25-26,34-35,44-48

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.


Psalm 97(98):1-4

CHANGES TO ARCHIDIOCESAN SAFEGUARDING POLICY: As you are well aware Armadale parish is committed to ensuring the safety of all children and vulnerable adults within our Community, and as anticipated there have been several changes to the screening and monitoring of all paid and volunteer workers within the Archdiocese of Perth. All parishes must become fully compliant by 1 August.

Safeguarding Forms 2 & 18 have now been superseded and all volunteers will be required to complete a Personal Declaration Form. These will be available at the Safeguarding Induction Refresher on Thursday and in the *foyer.* Some people will also require a National Police Clearance. If you are one of these volunteers, you will be contacted by the office.

If you volunteer in any way within our parish, even if only occasionally, you are required to attend one of the sessions on Thursday. Please register online or telephone the SG Office. Over the next couple of months we will be preparing for an audit and would appreciate your ongoing co-operation as we work to ensure the parish meets the new requirements.
